#### A DEVOTIONAL WORD...

Before I was afflicted, I went astray, but now I keep your word (Psalm 119:67)

#### IS GOD TRYING TO GET YOUR ATTENTION?

I was raised in a Baptist Church, but like many young Christians, I started to drift away from the church in high school, and then more so in college. A couple of years after college, I accepted a job in east Kentucky designing & constructing coal handling facilities. The living and work conditions were not the best, but as a driven young man, dollar signs were at the top of the priorities.

About a year into the job, my job duties increased with a promotion to manage our underground survey team for our underground mines. It's very important to know where you are mining underground to avoid mining on other people's property, and to ensure you don't break through into old workings. Old mines fill up with water, and it's very possible to flood an active mine very quickly if a miner breaks through, jeopardizing the miners' lives.

Whenever one of the surveyors did not report to work, I had to fill in. Putting on your hardhat, self-rescuer, and other safety equipment to ride down deep under a mountain will start one to consider the afterlife. All of our underground mines were approximately 5 feet or less in height, so the miners had to walk on their knees. Miners drive 4 ft. high "buggies" to transport coal from the working mine face, and to dump it on a conveyor that takes it to the surface. They stick their heads out of the left side of the buggy to see where to drive; they can't see directly in front of them or to the right side. The surveyors are responsible to get themselves out of the way when a buggy is coming; so they are constantly hopping about to avoid getting hit. Oh, one other thing, methane gas that is escaping the mine walls sounds like fizzing Alka-seltzers 24 hours a day.

One day during one of these surveying experiences, God spoke to me about getting my life in order. Soon after, I met a wonderful Christian woman who became my wife, joined a local church, got baptized (2nd time), started teaching a boys' Sunday School class, and we have been blessed many ways on the journey that God has put us on.

God first had to get my attention. Is God trying to get your attention? Hopefully He will not have to place you a mile underground like he did once with a stubborn young man to get your attention! To get your attention, God will allow suffering, sickness, adversity, anguish, trials and heartaches in our life. God loves us, and He doesn't want us to go through life from one crisis to another. He wants us to build our life on a solid foundation which is founded on the truth of His Holy Word. If God didn't love us, He wouldn't bother trying to get our



# CHURCH UPDATES


- ◆ Fellowship & Connections Committee (Maria French)

With their approval, Pastor Ryan has called a temporary team together to investigate incorporation, provide information and communication to the congregation, and ultimately to put forth a recommendation for the church body's consideration regarding our legal structure and organization. Serving on the team will be our current Trustees (Dan Huff, Danny Webb, and Greg Yonce), our Deacon Chair Bill Smyer, and our Stewardship Chair Sam Sweeney. More information will be provided as it becomes available.
